Women's Rights in Afghanistan

Afghanistan is a country with great promise and wonderful people. It is near China and Pakistan and shares its wonderful cultures with other countries of Asia. However, it still has many problems with education.

In February of 2022, six people suddenly disappeared. These people were joining (21) to fight for the rights of women. They did not use (22) or fight using weapons or angry words, because they wanted to show the people of Afghanistan and the world that they needed to care more about education for girls. After that, however, these people disappeared and never returned to their homes or villages. The local police believed that some religious groups had taken these people from their homes in the night. This gave the local towns that were fighting for better education more fear and stress.

In 2021, 48.7% of the Afghanistan population was female, but many of them were not allowed to attend schools by local religious groups. 43% of the children couldn't go to school, and 60% of them were female. In some areas of the country, 85% of the girls couldn't enter schools. Afghanistan is the fourth on the "worst countries for education for girls" ranking. It is clear to the world that the people who joined (21) had a lot to fight for.

This is why many people were worried about the six missing people. If these people couldn't tell others about why they needed to educate girls in Afghanistan, the government couldn't begin to improve education for every female child in all areas in the country. To make this happen, they needed everyone's voice. So, many people around the world were praying for their safety.
